







Lesley GRATEFUL FOR SECOND CHANCE

WHEN LESLEY TOGNI WAS IN HER DARKEST HOURS SHE DREW STRENGTH FROM THE STORIES OF OTHERS FACING ADVERSITY. NOW SHE SHARES HER STORY TO HELP OTHERS.

Lesley was on a long-weekend camping trip in Swan Hill when she slipped on the caravan step and hit her head on a steel object on the neighbouring campsite. She was knocked unconscious. "Everything went dead black. Then nothing," Lesley said. When she awoke, she was at Swan Hill Hospital insisting she didn't need a helicopter transfer to Melbourne. Lesley had suffered a broken neck, three fractures to her skull and a piece broken off, and a bleed on the brain.

She spent six days in the Royal Melbourne Hospital (RMH). "The first three days were hell and very depressing. I wasn't a priority, other worse accidents came in," Lesley said. "They couldn't give me painkillers as I was fasting for surgery. I had to lay on my back and not move, just looking at the ceiling."

Lesley talks passionately about what got her through that tough time.

"When I was there, down and out. I thought of the guys that were in the mines that came out. I thought about the kids in the Thai cave, and I thought about Stuart Diver at Thredbo."

Lesley says she didn't know why she thought of them. "I don't know, it's very spiritual. Maybe the universe said, 'look Lesley, we'll give you these three people in your mind to help you cope.' Their suffering would have been worse than mine. At least I knew, at the end of the day, I was going to come out of this. None of them knew," Lesley added. "I was lucky to be alive and not ending up with a brain injury or being a paraplegic."

Lesley would love to convey to those people how they aided her. "Your story helped me get through when I was in a dark hole. People don't realise the impact of sharing their stories. That is what got me through."

After her stay in RMH, Lesley was transferred to Camperdown Hospital for about five days.

"They were really great in that hospital, no complaints at all," Lesley said.

"Then I came back to Timboon (TDHS) which is like winning the lottery. If you're lucky enough to have the chance of coming to this hospital, you are the luckiest person. They go over and above. I do palliative care here, so I know a lot of them, but the point is they are unreal, just unbelievable. They are there for you, they care for you, they're also counsellors – you know talking to me, listening to me, advising me."

"You can have the best building, but it's not the building, it's the people inside. It's the people inside who are amazing here."

Lesley was a patient at TDHS for about 4 weeks. "I am very independent, too independent sometimes. I thought, 'I'm ready to go home'. The nurses tried to convince me to stay on a little longer, or at least

do it gradually. The night before I was to go home, I couldn't sleep. I started having a bit of anxiety. I knew I wasn't ready to go home. In the morning they came in and I started crying, I couldn't stop." Lesley told the nurses "I don't think I can go home." They worked on a discharge plan that suited Lesley's needs, with a gradual return to home. "Then a few days later I felt ready to go home. Everyone was very good about it," Lesley said.

Visits from home help and the district nurses have been helpful. "Now I mainly need home help for the things I can't do – I can't bend down or look up with my neck. I am also suffering vertigo since the accident. It's all good except I can't drive.

Lesley is also living with multiple myeloma however the cancer is at the back of Lesley's mind. "I've had a good life, I've got a good husband, kids, family and friends, I've done everything, and someone has to die. At least it's not someone younger like one of my kids. So, I live in the now. What happens down the track – I'll meet than when it comes. I am very grateful, that it's not worse."

Lesley looks forward to returning to her garden. Even if she can't do the digging and weeding, she enjoys meditating in her garden. Lesley anticipates a return to camping when she is physically ready to.

"Life's good again now. God did not want to take me and gave me a second chance. Maybe it was to tell my story."

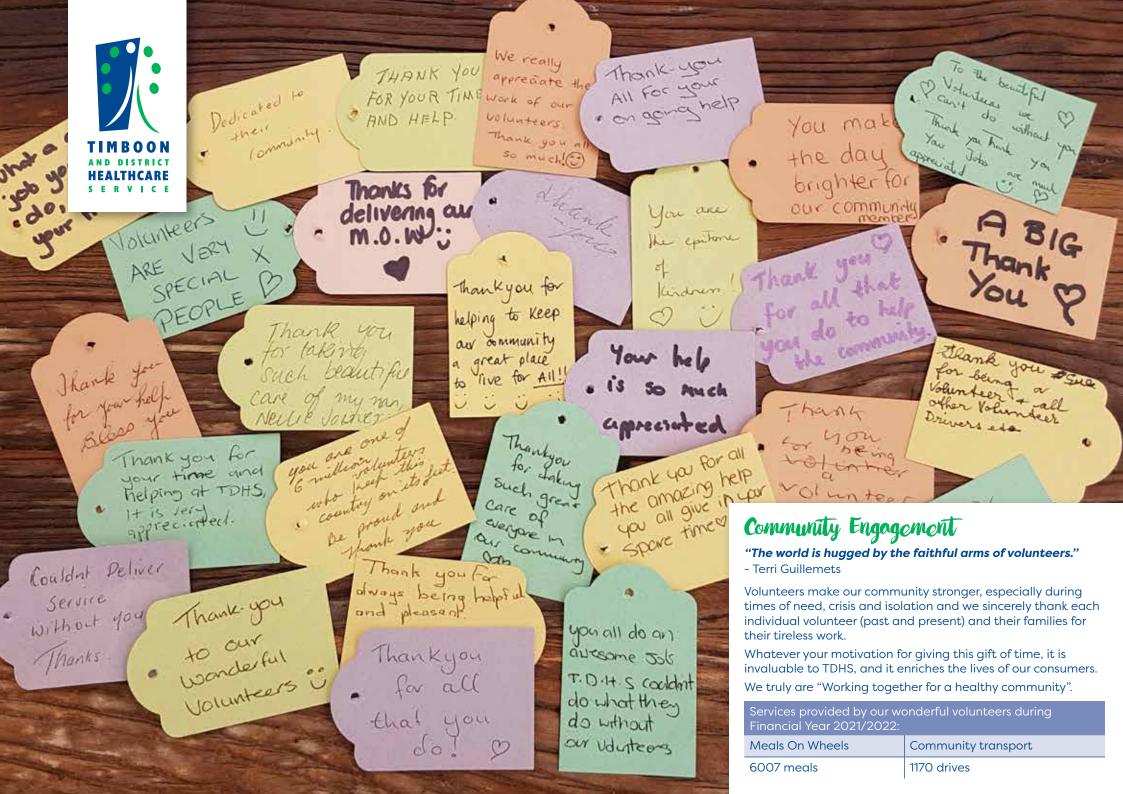

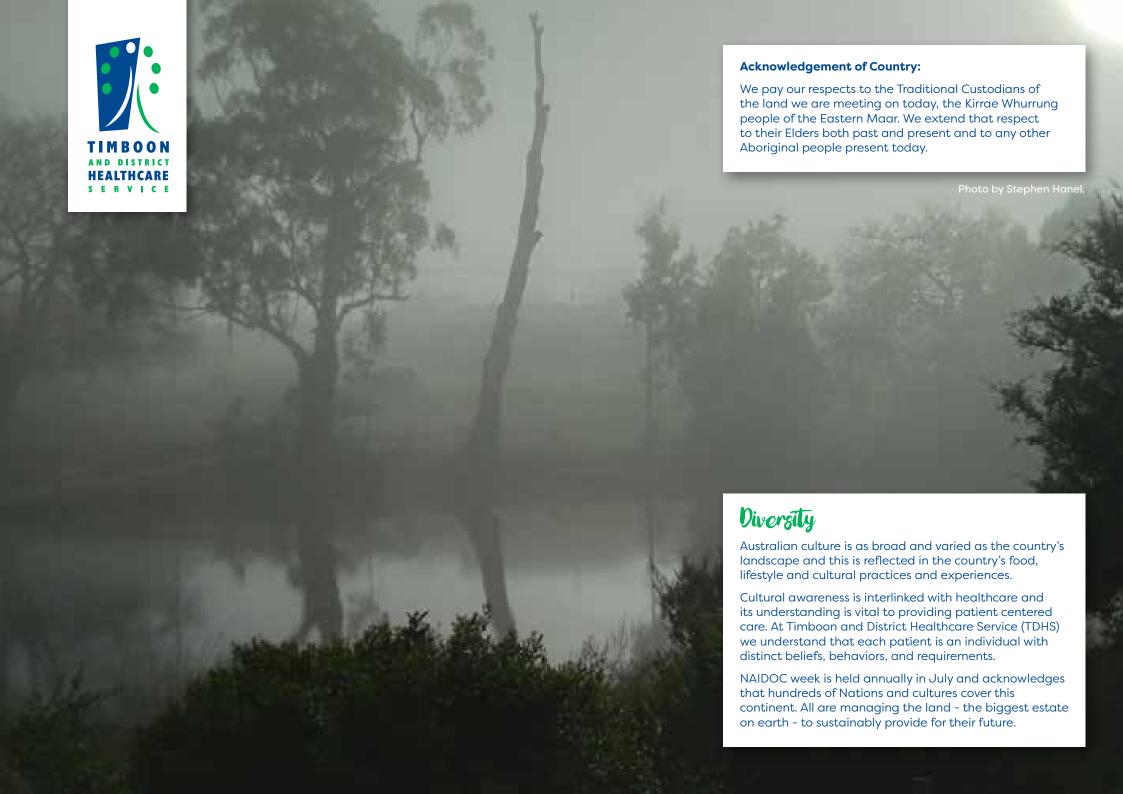

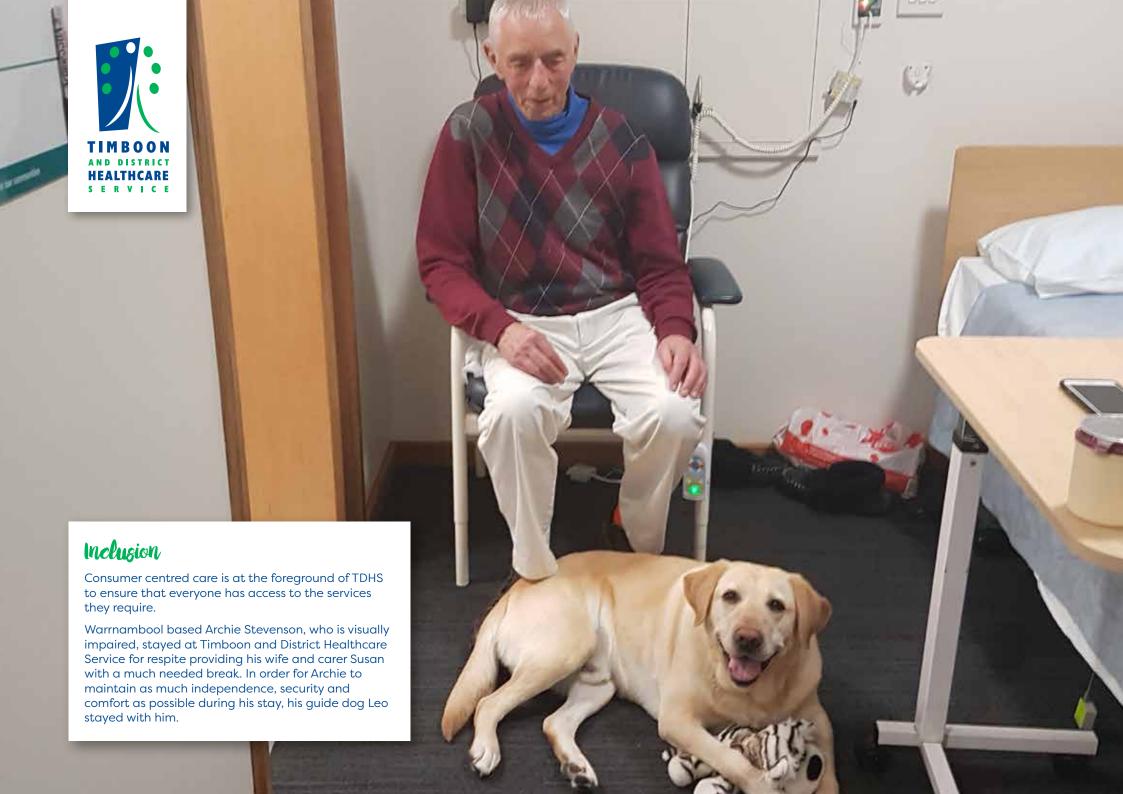
